

_____). One of the possible outcomes of such an action is that your contract with us may be terminated, resulting in your removal from your course or the admissions procedure.

2. Admissions and the contract

2.1 The offer we make to you is subject to you satisfying the academic and other requirements for admission prescribed by the University's relevant school of studies in the offer. The offer may be conditional or unconditional. If the offer is conditional, we will set out the conditions in the offer you need to fulfil in order to be admitted to the course. If you have not fulfilled the conditions of your offer before the start of the course, we reserve the right to withdraw the offer.

2.2 We may withdraw the offer if we will verify the authenticity of documentation required to evidence your qualifications prior to admission as appropriate.

2.4 As the contract between you and us is made exclusively by means of distance communication, you may cancel the contract by informing us in writing within fourteen (14) days of you accepting the offer ('the cancellation period'). In order to cancel the contract within the cancellation period, you should give us written notice of your cancellation by contacting Undergraduate Admissions (ug.applicants@sussex.ac.uk

_____) and you may complete the cancellation form set out at www.sussex.ac.uk/study/terms-and-conditions/cancellation to give this notice. If any payment has been made under the contract prior to the date of cancellation pursuant to this paragraph (including the payment of any deposit), we will provide you with a full refund in accordance with our Financial Refund or Rebate Policy www.sussex.ac.uk/termsandconditions/financepolicies.

2.5 When you apply to study at the University, you will need to demonstrate, at the point of registration, that you have a valid immigration status to undertake the proposed studies. If you fail to demonstrate that you have a valid immigration status we reserve the right to prevent you from registering on your course

4.3 The UK Government has changed the law to increase the fee caps for undergraduate courses in line with the Retail Price Index excluding mortgage interest payments ("RPIX") measure of inflation for higher education institutions assessed as having "high teaching standards". Higher education institutions who meet the "high teaching standards" assessment threshold are permitted to charge increased fees for undergraduate courses. The University of Sussex meets this threshold and, we set course fees to the maximum amount we are entitled to charge by law e.g. £9,250 for the Academic Year 2017/18. Your course fees will continue to increase annually in line with the maximum levels set by Government for subsequent academic years of your course. We will publish notice of these annual increments in advance of the relevant Academic Year.

5. Withdrawal or variation of courses and modules

5.1 Due to the period between prospectus publication and registration, circumstances may change due to factors beyond our reasonable control and therefore it may sometimes be necessary to vary the content of the course or services described in the prospectus. We will use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that changes are kept to a minimum, but if we are required to make any material changes to your course (as described in the offer letter and/or prospectus) before you register at the University, we shall bring these to your attention as soon as possible; if you reasonably believe that the proposed change will prejudicially affect you, you may either cancel the contract and withdraw your application for the course without any liability to us for course fees (even if the cancellation period has expired) or transfer to such other course (if any) as may be offered by us for which our arrangements are similar to those of the course to which you are transferred.

provided by us you may cancel the contract and withdraw from the course without incurring any further liability for course fees, and you shall be entitled to a refund of all course fees paid to date. This sub-clause does not apply to courses where work placements are mandatory for the award.

5.4 If you choose to cancel the contract in accordance with paragraph 5.1, 5.2, 5.3.1 or 5.3.3, we will use reasonable endeavours to assist you in finding an alternative comparable course with another Higher Education provider in the UK.
